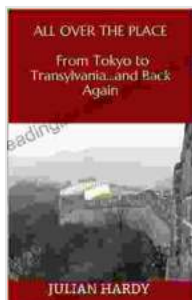

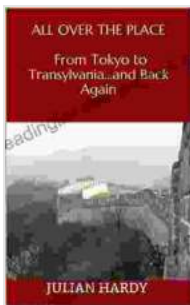


Bran Castle is said to be the inspiration for Dracula's castle.
