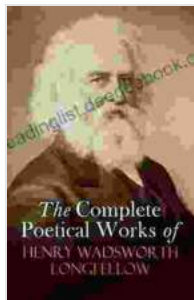

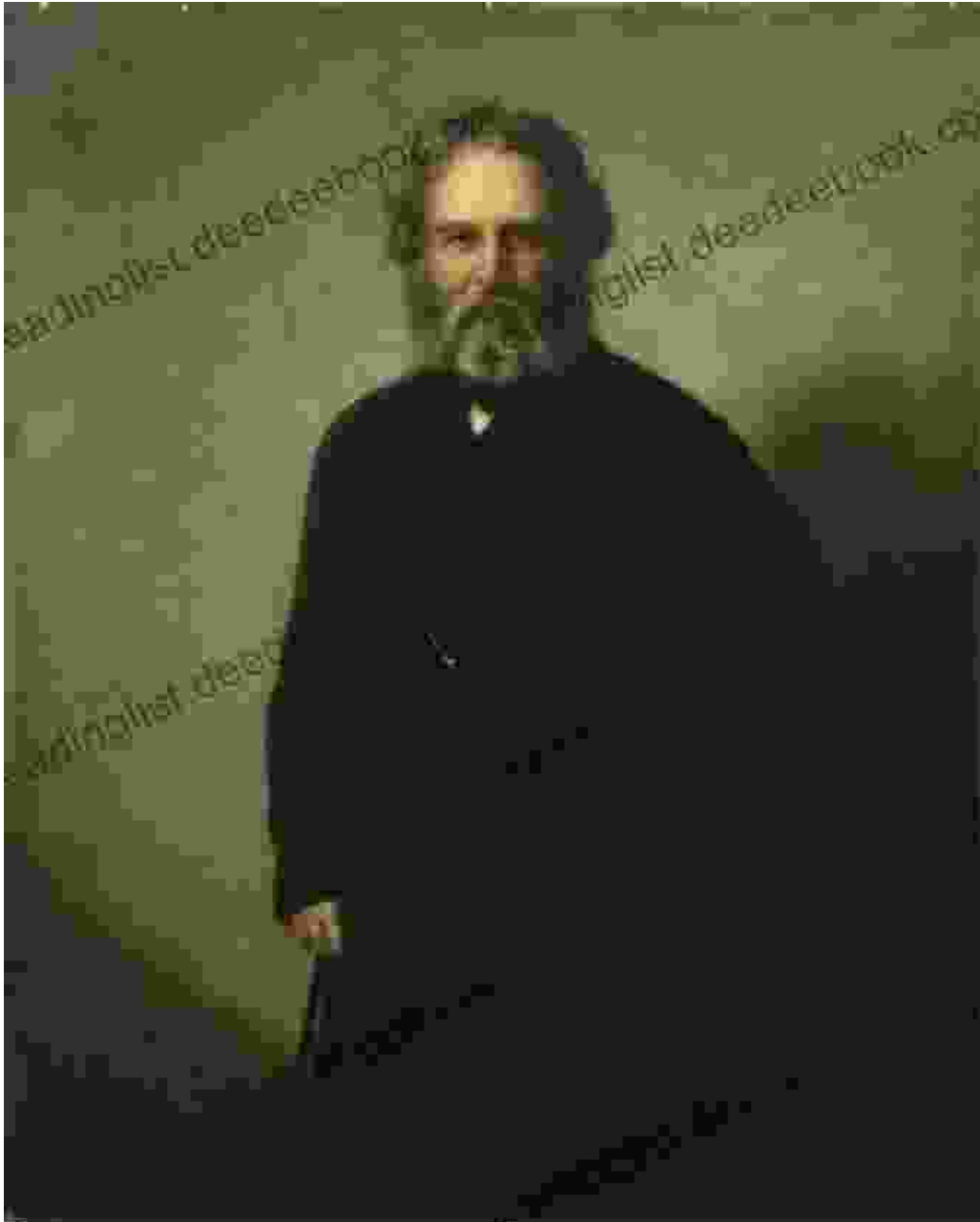

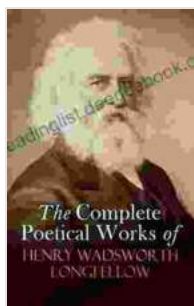
Henry Wadsworth Longfellow: A Brief Biography

Longfellow began writing poetry in his youth and published his first collection,

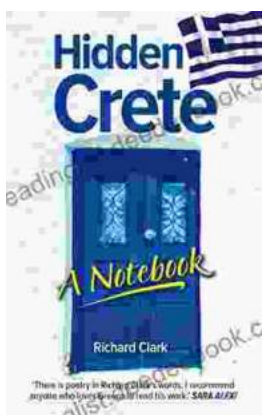
