
The knit stitch is the most basic knitting stitch. To do the knit stitch, follow these steps:

The purl stitch is the second most basic knitting stitch. To do the purl stitch, follow these steps:

- 1. Insert your right-hand needle into the back loop of the next stitch on your left-hand needle.
- 2. Pick up the working yarn and bring
